- Specifically Authorized Study
- Research Demonstration Projects
- Study Under Section 204 of WRDA 92, as amended (33 USC 2326)

STUDY FUNDING FY 07

- Operation and Maintenance - ?
- Specifically authorized studies.- 7 studies House & Senate - \$2.3 million; 2 Ongoing programs - \$2.4 million
- Regional Sediment Management Demonstrations - \$3.641 Million House & \$2.041 million Senate
- Beneficial Use of Dredged Material - \$5 million House and Senate
- Coastal Louisiana - \$20 million plus \$11 million supplemental

PROJECT FUNDING

- Dredged material disposal facility or process as O&M
- Specifically authorized beneficial use project
- Research demonstration project
- Section 204 beneficial use project

FY 07 Project Funding

- Poplar Island, MD - \$13 million
- Hamilton Wetlands Restoration, CA - \$12
- Indiana Harbor, CDF -\$20 million
- Oakland Harbor, CA -\$43 million*
- Houston Galveston, TX- \$43 million*
- Dredged Material Facilities-\$18 million
- Shoreline Mitigation (7 projects) - \$26 million*

WRDA 06 Help

- Senate WRDA Section 2012 –Regional Sediment Management
 - Increased cost shared beneficial use
 - Regional Sediment Management at Federal expense
 - \$30 million per FY authorized with up to \$5 million for studies
- House WRDA Section 2012 – Beneficial Use of Dredged Material similar provisions.
